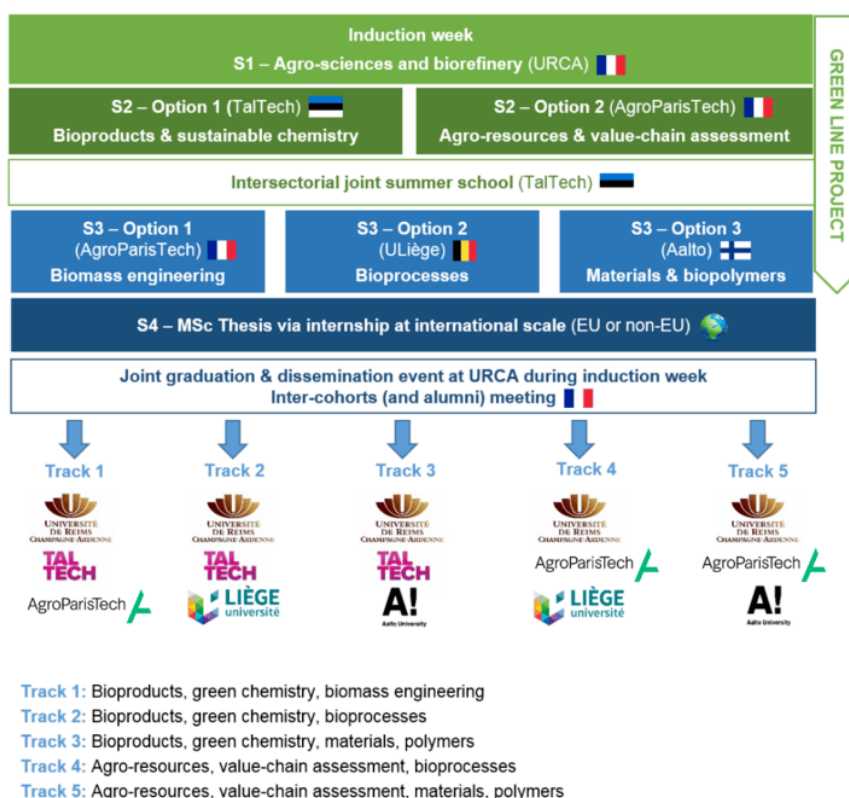
1. Mobility requirements and assigned study track

Bioceb is a two-year, integrated EMJM jointly designed and delivered by the Consortium partners. The full list of courses is available on the website⁵.

- 1.1. EMJM includes compulsory physical mobility periods for all enrolled students (EMJM scholarship-holders or not), consisting of a minimum of:
- **two study periods** (1 study period = 1 semester = 30 ECTS credits),
 - **in two countries**,
 - which must be **different from the country of residence of the Student at enrolment stage** ("stable residence in the months before enrolment").

Compulsory mobility periods cannot be replaced by virtual mobility (but other periods can). All study periods must take place in Bioceb universities or under their direct supervision.

- 1.2. The following study tracks and physical mobility periods can be offered to the students. More details can be found on the Bioceb website⁶.

1.3. The number of students that can be accepted into Bioceb universities/tracks is limited due to logistical and human resource constraints.

1.4. The following study track is assigned to the Student by the Bioceb Board:

2. EMJM Scholarship

2.1. The EMJM scholarship will be awarded to the Student:

Academic years: 2026-2027 and 2027-2028

Starting date: The first day of the Induction Week at URCA (August 26th 2026), or in case of delay, the first day of attending classes in-person at URCA, and provided that the Student has completed all the necessary steps for enrolment at URCA.

Duration: 24 months, unless the Student leaves early or the scholarship is interrupted (see below), and provided that the Student has completed all the necessary steps for enrolment at the Bioceb Universities of his/her study track.

Estimated ending date: August 31st 2028 at the latest.

- 2.2. The scholarship will be a contribution to the costs incurred by the Student and shall cover travel, visa, installation and subsistence costs. It is calculated on the basis of a monthly unit cost for the entire period needed by the enrolled scholarship holder to complete the study programme **pro rata of the actual number of days**. This period covers study, research, placement activities, thesis preparation and defence, in line with the requirements of the EMJM Bioceb. During this period, the scholarship can only be awarded in full, and to full-time students. Students who have previously obtained an EMJM scholarship are not eligible to apply for an additional scholarship under the EMJM.
- 2.3. The scholarship is awarded for full-time enrolment and will cover the entire duration of the EMJM Bioceb (24 months).
- 2.4. Calculation of the maximum scholarship per Student: **€1,400/month x DS**. Where **DS** = duration of the EMJM Bioceb (24 months)
- 2.5. The Student will receive a scholarship up to €33,600 in total, granted by the European Commission to finance his/her participation in the two-year EMJM Bioceb, starting in the academic year 2026-2027. **The final amount of the scholarship can be reduced as it is calculated pro rata of the actual number of days of studies during the mobility periods.**
- 2.6. The scholarship includes:
 - A monthly allowance of €1,400 to cover travel, visa and a living allowance, **pro rata of the actual number of days of the mobility periods**. The scholarship can be reduced if the minimum mobility requirements are not fulfilled (proportionate amount corresponding, for instance, to the missing mobility period of the concerned academic semester). The Student understands it is his/her responsibility to plan the use of the scholarship in a reasonable and responsible manner.

Example

Student arrival: 12/09/2026;
Student drop-out: 25/12/2026



- A full participation costs waiver

- In addition, the Student will benefit from an Insurance scheme paid by Bioceb and provided by EMSP/Marsh insurance⁷, according to the Minimum Requirements for the health and accident insurance coverage provided under EMJM. The coverage will take effect from when the Student starts his/her journey to participate in the master course (maximum two months before the start of the master course) and until at least two months after the end of the studies (end of the course, unless the Student leaves earlier).
- 2.7. The Student shall open a personal European bank account in € currency and shall provide the details of this account to the Bioceb Secretariat (official document from the bank “RIB”, including the name, the address, the BIC and IBAN). As the coordinating institution, AgroParisTech shall transfer the scholarship monthly to this account.
- 2.8. For AgroParisTech to transfer the correct scholarship amount, **calculated pro rata of the actual number of days of the mobility periods**, the Student commits to:
- provide a copy of his/her visa
 - provide a copy of his/her boarding passes, train tickets, or any other proofs of transport
 - sign the attendance sheet for the induction week and at all events where this is requested
 - complete his/her enrolment procedures at each host institution and submit all required documentation on time
 - provide the “certificate of arrival” to be signed upon arrival at each university
 - provide the “certificate of departure” to be signed before departure at each university
 - provide a certificate of arrival and certificate of completion of the M2 internship/master's thesis signed by the host institution and the Student
 - provide any other documents requested by the Bioceb Secretariat
 - maintain active communication with the Bioceb Secretariat and respond promptly to official enquiries throughout the entire duration of the Master's programme
 - inform Bioceb immediately of any interruption in attendance.
- 2.9. The Student shall refuse any other EU-funded scholarship while receiving an EMJM scholarship.
- 2.10. The scholarship does not create or entitle an employer-employee relation between Bioceb and the Student.
- 2.11. The Student may be authorised to temporarily leave Bioceb by the Bioceb Board, for duly justified and well-documented reasons. Such cases relate to medical reasons and/or serious family reasons (e.g., need to temporarily take care of a close family member or hospitalisation/death of a family member). The Student shall send a written request to the Bioceb Secretariat explaining the reasons for the interruption of studies. The Bioceb Board may summon the Student to an interview (in person or via video

conference) and request additional information/documents to clarify the situation. The Bioceb Board will evaluate requests on a case-by-case basis and will inform the Student of any conditions and consequences of the interruption of studies. The scholarship payment may be interrupted from the first day of leave and until the Student is again physically present at the Bioceb University in which he/she is enrolled, and can actively resume the academic programme.

- 2.12.** If the Student is not able to follow the academic programme and successfully meet the EMJM Bioceb requirements within the 24 months of his/her edition due to the above-mentioned reasons, upon written request from the Student addressed to the Bioceb Secretariat, the Bioceb Board will make its best efforts find acceptable ways to allow the Student to finish the EMJM Bioceb within one of the following editions. The extension cannot exceed 12 months and cannot give rise to additional funding/scholarship for the Student.
- 2.13.** Suspension or termination of the scholarship may be decided by the Bioceb Board, and partial or full reimbursement to the Bioceb Coordinating Institution (AgroParisTech) of undue amounts may be required in cases of: unreported and unjustified absence, persistent lack of communication or failure to respond to official requests, early-departure, withdrawal, drop-out, serious misconduct, false information, exclusion, or any other conduct that does not comply with the rules governing the payment of the scholarship under the Erasmus Mundus programme. The Student shall return the required amount within 30 days. Failure to do so may result in additional bank charges and interest, and/or legal action.

3. Contribution to individual needs of students with disabilities

- 3.1.** Provided the Student fulfils the general eligibility conditions, the contribution for individual needs⁸ can be used for an enrolled Student (with or without a scholarship) who meets the cumulative conditions listed below:
- with disabilities (e.g., long-term physical, mental, intellectual or sensory impairments)
 - certified by a competent national authority
 - of such nature that his/her participation in the action would not be possible without the special needs items or services
 - such as those related to the acquisition of special items or services (e.g., assistance by third persons, adaptation of work environment, additional travel/transportation costs)
 - the special needs items or services are not already covered from another source (such as social security or health insurance)

- the number of units declared corresponds to the number of special needs units that were needed for implementing the action

3.2. The support to cover such individual needs of an enrolled Student, will take the form of the following special needs unit costs:

- (a) €3,000
- (b) €4,500
- (c) €6,000
- (d) €9,500
- (e) €13,000
- (f) €18,500
- (g) €27,500
- (h) €35,500
- (i) €47,500
- (j) €60,000

3.3. Calculation of the unit cost contribution per Student:

- Enrolled students will declare what type of items/services are needed and their cost.
- The Student will provide a declaration with an estimation of costs and Certification by a competent national authority of the long-term impairment of the concerned Student.
- The applicable unit cost will be identified as the rate corresponding to or immediately lower than the estimated expenses.
- This unit cost is a contribution, and is not intended to fully cover the actual costs.
- Costs below the lowest rate (i.e., less than €3,000) will not be eligible for additional support and will have to be covered by Bioceb funds or by other funding sources of the Bioceb universities.

3.4. The unit costs will take the form of a monthly unit contribution, calculated as follows: {special needs unit x (1/number of months)}. The number of months in the formula above shall correspond to the number of months the special needs items or services were used or produced for implementing the action, depending on the nature of the items or services. For one-off costs, the number of months shall correspond to 1.

4. Studies

4.1. Relevant information concerning the structure, organisation, grading system, rules and course content of the EMJM Bioceb is published on the Bioceb website⁹ and forms an integral part of this Student's Agreement. Courses are taught in English. All partners offer local language and culture courses.

4.2. The Bioceb Universities shall use their best efforts to offer Student with teaching, supervision, assessment and support services of a professional standard.

4.3. The following rules shall apply:

- ECTS are awarded upon successful completion of a course-unit, in accordance with the local regulations of the host university. Failed courses must be retaken according to the host university's re-sit regulations.
- The Student shall acquire mandatory 120 ECTS credits corresponding to the mandatory course-unit of the curriculum. In order to enter in the second year of the programme, 60 ECTS of the programme have to be validated at the end of the first year.
- No optional ECTS can be required, even though some can be offered if the Student participates in optional activities. Such optional ECTS shall not compensate for mandatory ECTS.
- Student shall validate each course-unit (no compensation possible among different course-units) in order to finalise the programme and obtain the master's degrees.
- Retakes shall be organised as often as possible in the initial exam-taking university. If impossible and/or in order to limit travel costs for the Student, the following university may offer the opportunity to organise the re-sit in its premises according to the previous university's rules.
- The Board shall evaluate case by case any exceptional situations.

- 4.4.** In addition, the Student shall follow the rules in place in each of the Bioceb universities in which he/she is enrolled, following the assigned study track. Each Bioceb university shall provide the Student with the relevant rules.
- 4.5.** Bioceb has a zero-tolerance policy on plagiarism. All violations are reported to the Coordinator and dealt with in accordance with the Bioceb Universities' local rules.
- 4.6.** At the end of the EMJM Bioceb, provided that the Student has successfully met the requirements and obtained 120 ECTS, he/she will receive three national master's Degrees awarded by the Universities in which he/she studied, according to his/her study track.
- 4.7.** Degrees awarded to all graduates:



- **Master in Biology AgroSciences (BAS)**¹⁰, issued by the University of Reims Champagne-Ardenne (URCA);
- **Bioceb Diploma**, issued by AgroParisTech: a French institution's diploma (*diplôme d'établissement*), which includes the logos of the Bioceb partner universities;
- **Bioceb Diploma Supplement**, issued by AgroParisTech: it encapsulates the joint nature ("jointness") of the programme, the individual mobility experience of each Student, details of the qualifications obtained, and a full transcript of all ECTS credits earned throughout the master's course.

4.8. Degrees awarded depending on the graduates' study track (2 Degrees awarded out of the 4):

- **Master Biology AgroSciences**, study track Biomass Engineering for Bioeconomy (BEB)¹¹, delivered by Université Paris-Saclay (UPSaclay), operated by AgroParisTech;
- **Master of Science (Technology)**¹², issued by Aalto University;
- **Master of Science in Engineering, Technology of Wood, Plastic and Textiles**¹³, issued by Tallinn University of Technology (TalTech), Estonia;
- **Master: Bioingénieur en chimie et bioindustries**, à finalité (Master in Bioengineering: Chemistry and Bio-industries, professional focus)¹⁴, issued by the University of Liège (ULiège).

5. Attendance

5.1. EMJM Bioceb has a duration of two academic years, beginning with the Bioceb Induction Week at URCA and ending at the Graduation ceremony. Attendance at Bioceb Induction Week is compulsory as it is part of the academic programme. The Student shall attend courses in at least three of the Bioceb universities, according to the study track assigned to the Student in Article 1. The Student shall duly attend the academic programme: all scheduled academic activities (lectures, practical sessions, guest lecturers' seminars, visits, field trips, internships etc.), all examinations and required assessments.

5.2. The Student commits to provide the documents listed in Article 2.8.

- 5.3. The Student shall enrol on a full-time basis, without undertaking any occupation with a regular salary in parallel to the studies of Bioceb.
- 5.4. The Student shall follow the rules for attendance and discipline in place in each of the Bioceb universities in which he/she is enrolled, following the assigned study track. Each Bioceb university shall provide the Student with the relevant rules.
- 5.5. The Student shall obtain his/her residence permit from the national and local authorities upon his/her arrival in the host country if required.
- 5.6. To be admitted to the following semester, the Students shall pass all compulsory examinations. The Student can be conditionally admitted to the following semester even if he/she has failed one exam, which must be re-sat and passed within the following semester. The Bioceb Board will evaluate case-by-case any exceptional situations.
- 5.7. The Student may only leave the host institution during official academic holidays established by the host institution.
- 5.8. Unjustified absences are not accepted and may impact the Student's results and/or standing within Bioceb.
- 5.9. If the Student is not able to follow the academic programme and successfully meet the EMJM Bioceb requirements within the 24 months of his/her edition due to the reasons mentioned in Article 2.11, then, upon written request from the Student addressed to the Bioceb Secretariat, the Bioceb Board will make its best efforts find acceptable ways to allow the Student to finish the EMJM Bioceb within one of the following editions. The extension cannot exceed 12 months and cannot give rise to additional funding/scholarship for the Student.
- 5.10. In the case that the Student, for duly motivated reasons, does not finish the Master's thesis within the current academic year, the Bioceb Board can grant an extension, upon written request from the Student. To obtain all three degrees, the Student must re-enrol at the three universities of his/her study track and pay the required tuition fees directly to each of them.
- 5.11. The Student shall behave ethically during his/her studies. He/she shall not act fraudulently, and shall especially not cheat, falsify or plagiarise any academic work. Moreover, he/she shall not abuse or misuse the access to equipment and installations and shall not engage in unauthorised access or violate local, university or institutional regulations. Any incident contrary to this Agreement shall be addressed by the Bioceb Board and may result in the Student's exclusion from the EMJM Bioceb. The student may also be subject to disciplinary procedures in accordance with the rules of the Bioceb Universities.

6. Exclusion

6.1. The Student may be excluded from the EMJM Bioceb, in the case that:

- Bioceb universities notice non-attendance to courses (lectures, practical sessions, field trips, informative and official meetings...) that the Student cannot justify with medical certificates, for which permission has not been granted by the Bioceb staff (to ensure permission, the Student shall ask in advance),
- Bioceb universities notices a persistent lack of communication or failure to respond to official requests,
- the Student fails to validate a semester of study,
- the Student is the subject of disciplinary measures leading to his/her exclusion from the Bioceb Universities,
- the Student is the subject of legal prosecutions that prevent him/her from attending Bioceb,
- the Student withdraws from the EMJM Bioceb, on his/her own decision or by force majeure.

6.2. In case of exclusion from the EMJM Bioceb, if the Student wishes to complete the national degree course at the university in which he/she is currently studying, the local rules will apply (in particular the appeal procedure, if existing).

6.3. In the event of exclusion, the Student shall reimburse the Bioceb Coordinating Institution (AgroParisTech) the excess funding from the scholarship allocated to him/her, which consists of any Bioceb funds received covering the period following the date of exclusion, according to the Erasmus + EMJM rules. The Student shall return the required amount within 30 days. Failure to do so may result in additional bank charges and interest, and/or legal action.

7. Modification of the Agreement and dispute resolution conditions

7.1. Any alteration to the present Agreement must be communicated in writing. All alterations to the initial situation must be immediately communicated by the Student to the Bioceb Secretariat and the Bioceb Coordinator. Upon mutual agreement of contractual modifications, Bioceb will issue an addendum to the present Agreement.

7.2. In the event of a complaint, the Student may appeal to the Bioceb Board by sending within 10 days a written statement to the Bioceb Secretariat explaining the reasons for the appeal. The Bioceb Board will examine the appeal and make its best efforts to resolve it within one month. The Bioceb Board may summon the Student to an interview (in person or via video conference) and request additional information/documents to clarify the situation. However, for any complaint specifically concerning a Bioceb university in which the Student is enrolled, appeals to the Bioceb Board will be ineligible. The Student must invoke the internal complaint procedure of that university, following the official rules of that university.

- 7.3.** Bioceb is exonerated from any responsibility for accidents, illnesses, injuries, losses or damages to persons or goods resulting from or in any way related to the activities that are the object of the present Agreement. The Student is obliged to accept the necessary insurance related to the activities for the full duration of the study period.
- 7.4.** This Agreement is valid until the end of the student's second academic year unless terminated earlier.
- 7.5.** In case of disagreement between the Student and Bioceb, the French courts shall be designated as the sole competent authorities to resolve any legal dispute between Bioceb and the Student arising from the contract. The present Agreement shall be governed by French law.
